

Extracting honey from bees involves several precise steps to ensure both the quality of the honey and the well-being of the bees. The process begins with inspecting the beehive to ensure the frames are filled with mature honey, indicated by capped cells. The uncapped frames are placed into an extractor, a centrifuge device that spins the frames at high speed. This action forces the honey out of the cells and it collects at the bottom of the extractor. The extracted honey is then filtered to remove any remaining wax particles and impurities.

Finally, the honey is poured into sterilized jars for storage. It is crucial to ensure that the bees have enough honey left in the hive for their own consumption, especially before winter. Proper handling and care are essential throughout the process to maintain the integrity of the honey and the health of the bee colony.
